

## Report for Snape Parish Council annual general meeting 28th May 2024 covering the 12 months to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024

## **Main activities**

Meet up Monday – every Monday at the Golden Key at 10:30am – everyone is welcome for free coffee/tea and cakes and biscuits. This is aimed at all age groups and is a great way to make friends in the village. It is also a venue for various charitable and social events throughout the year. Rural Coffee Caravan visit occasionally offering handy services such as walking stick ferrule replacement, advice on fall alarms, and related topics. Attendance continues with around 15-20 attendees each week, though the mix varies – some are regulars, others are occasional **Good Neighbour Tasking** – Derek Malyn continues to operate the Duty Phone giving a very responsive service. We offer lifts to medical appointments regularly, and other tasks such as minor DIY and gardening on an ad hoc basis (for example, if someone is unwell). Nearly 100 tasks were completed during the year

## Funding

We haven't received any funding since 2020/21 apart from a kind 'windfall' donation from the closing balances of the Snape Goodfellowship in December 2021 of £610.00. However, to replenish our shrinking funds, a few months ago we received the following grants — plus the generous recent promise from Snape Parish Council within their 2024/25 budget of £260.00 per annum, to cover our fixed costs of insurance and phone rental:

- East Suffolk District Council Enabling Communities Fund, jointly from our three District Councillors £900
- Communities Together East Suffolk £400
- The Snape "Grumpies" club £50
- Community Action Suffolk £30 (Co-op vouchers)
